Schloß Igls

A luxurious tradition

Schloß Igls is a luxurious residence providing exquisite accommodation and rejuvenation for discerning guests. The property was built for an aristocrat to enjoy summer. Dr Fred Beck purchased the estate and transformed it into an elegant luxury hotel. The aristocratic heritage and ambience are preserved in the rooms and suites. The new owners transformed the property from a luxury hotel to a luxury residence. The property provides five star service and an opulent refuge. Unprecedented privacy and seclusion allow guests to enjoy impeccable amenities, delicious cuisine and a romantic ambience.

A magnificent natural environment complements the luxurious estate. The elegant white palace is located on the Igls plateau in the Tyrolean Alps. The village of Igls is five kilometres from the Tyrolean capital of Innsbruck. The property offers guests 5,000 square metres of enchanting gardens and views of the Nordkette mountain range and Patscherkofel mountain. The property is a natural and architectural sanctuary.

The Schloß exudes a rich aristocratic history. It was a private summer residence built in 1887 for the University of Innsbruck professor of anatomy Karl Dantscher, the Count of Kollensberg. Hotelier Dr Fred Beck purchased the property and surrounding parkland in 1963. He transformed the property into a luxury hotel after extensive renovations. Schlosshotel Igls welcomed guests in 1970. The luxury hotel was a member of Relais and Châteaux hotel association between 1985 and 2012. After renovations Schlosshotel Igls became Schloß Igls in April 2012. A five star luxury hotel became a five star luxury residence. In 2013, Hans and Pia van Eenennaam – Beck assumed ownership and management of the property. Pia is the daughter of Dr Fred Beck. She continues the heritage and passion for owning and managing luxury properties.

The palatial property consists of eighteen rooms and suites and the Boutique Apartment. The Grand Suite incorporates 110 square metres of opulence. A fireplace, antique furniture and fine fabrics are prominent in the suite. The boutique apartment provides 200 square metres of sanctuary. It was designed by Moretti, an Italian architect. A separate entrance to the Boutique Apartment introduces guests to a world of private opulence. An elegant salon encompassing 60 square metres and a private terrace provides refuge. A study and library allows guests to gaze at the Nordkette mountains. Two spacious bedrooms with connecting

doors, a marble bathroom and Tyrolean country style kitchen add to the ambience. Guests have access to the indoor swimming pool and gardens.

Exquisite amenities reflect the aristocratic heritage of the property. The Blue Salon combines pastel blue and pale timber to create a relaxing ambience and a private sphere to enjoy a banquet. The room encompasses 40 square metres of beauty and refinement. The Lounge Bar is a masterpiece. Fine upholstered antique furniture invites guests to a historic room in the property. The fireplace enhances the majestic ambience. The Schloß Spa provides guests with the opportunity to rejuvenate. A large indoor swimming pool provides panoramic views of the imperial scenery and exquisite gardens. A Finnish sauna, massage room, steam room and lounges provide guests with ample time to relax.

A distinguished restaurant creates impeccable cuisine for guests to enjoy. Dietmar E. Fröhlich is the executive chef. His experience includes roles at several luxury hotels including Hotel Klosterbräu, a five star property in nearby Seefeld, Tyrol and the opulent Hotel Jagdhof located in Neustift im Stubaital, Tyrol. His culinary expertise creates culinary art and dishes at the request of guests. An à la carte menu is prepared for breakfast. Lunch offers a variety of options to satisfy the palate of discerning guests. The dinner menu offers a variety of options. Guests can enjoy buffets utilising Mediterranean, Asian, vegetarian and vegan recipes. Local Tyrolean dishes are also available. Four to seven course menus are prepared for guests. All meals are prepared to satisfy the guest and consider their tastes and dietary requirements. Every detail is prepared according to the desires of the guest from the exquisite flower arrangements to the musical programme.

Privacy is an important characteristic. The beautiful wrought iron gates close after guests arrive. Guests enjoy the entire property. The primary difference between the property and a luxury hotel is the high degree of seclusion enjoyed by guests. The level of privacy guests enjoy is unprecedented.
