The care, attention, hospitality and amenities surpassed the properties operated by hotel chains or management companies.

Austrian luxury hotels comprise a large proportion of the properties in the guide. Austria has a long and distinguished heritage providing discerning guests with opulent residences, impeccable hospitality, excellent rejuvenation amenities and fine cuisine. Many hotels are owned and managed by the same family for several generations. Fine hospitality is celebrated throughout the country.

Riederluxusgleichung

We developed Riederluxusgleichung also known as the Rieder luxury equation to determine properties for the guide. The equation considered several factors. It assessed hotel category, culinary excellence, spa facilities, hospitality, interior design, architecture, ambience and exclusive location. It involves quantitative and qualitative parameters. Many factors create an exceptional luxury hotel. Not every element can be measured accurately using a mathematical equation.

The properties are divided into eleven categories. The categories are: Granderwasser, palatial opulence, resort, sport, wellness, city grandeur, alpine splendour, natural escape, five-star superior, culinary excellence and pleasurable experiences.

An architectural treasure in Nevsky Prospekt. The grand hotel is a magnet for the social and political elite since 1875.

Italian architect Carlo Rossi designed the magnificent exterior. Russian architect Fyodor Lidval redecorated the interior with an Art Nouveau style in 1908. French designer Leon Benois installed the prominent stained-glass windows. It is a heritage monument with restored stucco, marble floor corridors, original balconies and oil paintings by distinguished Russian artists.

L'Europe is the oldest continuous restaurant in Russia. It was established in 1905 and celebrates imperial indulgence. The exquisite stained-glass window depicting Apollo on a chariot and carved wooden balconies on the mezzanine level complement the

exceptional cuisine. Executive chef Ian Minnis creates masterpieces such as, caviar covered blinis, veal poached in port and beef rib-eye in Amarena cherry sauce.


The Presidential Suite competes with the Historic Suites for prestige. The Presidential Suite occupies 350 square metres of living space. It is a grand two-bedroom suite providing a private dining room with eight seats, a





Hotel Schloss Fuschl, Hof bei Salzburg, Salzburg



Exquisite architecture, beautiful landscape and location greet guests arriving at the opulent palace. It was built in 1450 for the Archbishop of Salzburg. It was a hunting lodge. It became a hotel in 1947. The property is situated on a peninsula in Fuschlsee, a lake in the Salzkammergut region. It embodies Austrian imperial grandeur and refinement. The Renaissance architecture complements the opulent interior design.

A wonderful spa comprising 1,100

square metres provides rejuvenation and relaxation. It features an outdoor sauna and hot tub. It offers a spectacular view of the natural environment.

An indoor swimming pool, Finnish sauna, steam bath and fireside relaxation room are part of the generous facilities. A fitness area offers yoga, power-plate training, fitness and aquacise. An extensive treatment program concentrating on anti-ageing and skincare products providing long-term advantages are available. Guests



Hotel Palais Coburg, Stadt Wien, Wien



A grand hotel located in the centre of Vienna. In the early 1840s, a majestic palace was built for Prince Ferdinand von Sachsen-Coburg, a cavalry general in the Austrian army. Austrian private foundation POK Pühringer Privatstiftung acquired the palace in 1997. In 2003, the luxury hotel opened after six years of planning and reconstruction.

The Coburg Suites embrace grandeur and opulence. The largest suites in the hotel range from 128 to 165 square metres of living space. The three maisonette suites are elegant with antique furniture and provide a view of the garden. Marie Antoinette and Victoria each offer a private terrace with considerable sunlight and a heated private sauna. The spa is a beautiful

refuge to enjoy relaxation. It offers an indoor swimming pool, sauna, steam bath, exercise area, sun terrace and conservatory. It also provides an extensive range of massage and beauty treatments.


Culinary excellence and artistry are celebrated in two restaurants. Executive chef Silvio Nickol is committed

Fiss is 1,436 metres above sea level providing an ideal location to enjoy hiking in summer and alpine skiing in winter. It began life as a hunting lodge and guesthouse in 1940. The Domenig family transformed the property into an extraordinary luxury hotel.

A palatial hideaway found on Mönchsberg, a hill in the centre of Stadt Salzburg. 1.4 hectares of beautiful parkland surrounds the opulent retreat. It provides an unparalleled view of the baroque rooftops of the city. The Mönchstein first appeared in a document in 1350 known as Tetelheimer Turm. The property expanded from a tower to an impeccable residence. It became a castle hotel in 1956.

Swiss entrepreneur Dr Hans-Peter Wild purchased the hotel in 2005. Host Samantha Teufel provides refined hospitality. In May 2018, the property opened after an extensive refurbishment.

Fine cuisine is served in two restaurants. Executive chef Markus Mayer manages the kitchen at the Glass Garden. It is in the centre of the recently

constructed glass dome. A large panoramic window façade opens offering a majestic view of the city. He creates balanced masterpieces using the finest ingredients. Restaurant Schloß Mönchstein is elegant with tapestries adorning the walls. It has a terrace and window façade. The cuisine is sophisticated and delicious.

The spa provides a noble experience.





It occupies 300 square metres with an outdoor infinity swimming pool, steam bath, Finnish sauna, relaxation area and gymnasium with advanced exercise equipment. Expert staff offer various massage treatments including classic, Mönchstein massage and Royal Thai aroma oil massage.

The Mönchstein Suite is found in the palace providing views of the city and parkland. It occupies 85 square metres of living space. Hotel Schloss Velden, Velden am Wörthersee, Kärnten



An exquisite palace decorated with Kaisergelb on the shore of the Wörthersee. It was completed in 1603 for Austrian aristocrat Bartholomew Khevenhüller.

Austrian porcelain manufacturer Ernst Wahliss purchased the palace at the end of the nineteenth century. Architect Wilhelm Heß designed a neo-Renaissance palace to replace the old one. Wahliss transformed it into a luxury hotel. It became a member of Falkensteiner Hotels in 2012. It features 104 guest rooms and suites, a private beach club with an outdoor swimming pool and access to the lake and marina.

The Acquapura SPA and Med SPA occupies 3,600 square metres. Classic design, modern art and the harmonious relationship between water and light create a refined

ambience. It features an indoor swimming pool, panoramic garden pool, bio-herbal sauna, infrared cabin, gemstone steam room, a cardio and fitness room with a view of the lake. The Medical SPA uses holistic medicine to reinvigorate and improve welfare. Eminent Austrian plastic surgeon Dr Peter Durnig offers radio frequency treatment, non-invasive fat reduction using cryolipolysis and three-dimensional breast analysis and





enhancement.

Restaurant Schlossstern and Seespitz provide culinary pleasure. Executive chef Thomas Gruber at Restaurant Schlossstern believes slow-cooking fine seasonal and local ingredients produces excellent cuisine. Seespitz is a lake-side restaurant serving fresh and light fine cuisine with a spectacular view of the Wörthersee and surrounding mountains. Alpine-Adriatic cuisine is the culinary style. It combines Austrian, Italian and Slovenian flavours. The Schlossbar and lobby lounge are elegant areas to enjoy innovative cocktails, outstanding spirits and fine wine.


Swarovski crystals. The Weinstube prepares Tyrolean cuisine for guests.

The Rock Spa provides 1,100 square metres of leisure. It was created around natural rocks. It comprises several saunas including a Finnish, herbal, outdoor, steam rooms and a

salted infrared room. The heated outdoor swimming pool and outdoor whirlpool offer another option. The tea bar serves several varieties of tea in the panorama and rock relaxation rooms. RELAX Guide awarded the property three lilies for the spa in the 2019 edition.








The Roter Salon serves fine whiskey, brandy and cigars. The Schloss Bar offers selected wine, beer cocktails and specialty coffee.

A palace enjoying a location on a rock above the Danube River offering panoramic views of the Wachau. It was built in 1630.

Johann and Rosemarie Thiery transformed the old building into a luxury hotel. Johannes Christian Thiery and Maria Katharina Thiery-Schroll continue the philosophy and dedication

pursued by their parents during the last fifty years.

Deluxe guest rooms and apartments range in size from 45 to 60 square metres of living space. The elegant rooms provide views of the Danube River or the village and castle ruin. Antique furniture, chandeliers, hardwood floors or carpet, king-size beds

and bedrooms are found in the guest rooms.

Guests can dine at the restaurant with an option to experience the Danube terrace or the Grill Tavern. Executive chef Hans Zusser creates fine Austrian cuisine using local fish, game from the surrounding woods and local produce. Wiener Schnitzel, goulash and





Marillenknödel are the masterpieces. The kitchen also creates exquisite international dishes. Since 2015, the Küffer Keller is a wine bar grill two minutes from the palace. It serves the Wachauer dry aged hamburger for lunch and uses wood fire to grill steak or fish in the evening.

The spa is an imperial refuge. An indoor swimming pool is found in the basement. The outdoor swimming pool is found in a courtyard lined with roses providing a view of the monastery and castle ruin. The property offers four massage treatments. Full and partial body massage, foot reflexology and Thai yoga therapy soothe the mind and soul.

Schloss Elmau, Krün, Bayern, Germany



A grand alpine resort in the Bavarian Alps near the Austrian border.

Philosopher and author Dr Johannes Müller built the palace between 1914 and 1916 for artists and his audience. A major fire destroyed the building in 2005. It was rebuilt and reopened in 2007. The retreat building is 150 metres west of the palace. It provides forty-seven suites, ten restaurants, a library, yoga pavilion and spa. It is a cultural retreat.

More than 200 classical music and

jazz concerts were staged in the concert hall since 1916.


In early December 2018, Das Edelweiss reopened after extensive renovation and expansion.




